

Georgia Republican Presidential Primary

Georgia: Huckabee 34% McCain 19% Romney 16%
 Thursday, January 24, 2008

While John McCain and Mitt Romney are fighting for the lead in Florida’s Presidential Primary on January 29, Mike Huckabee has the lead in Georgia.

The latest Rasmussen Reports telephone survey in Georgia finds Huckabee with 34% of the vote followed by McCain at 19%, Romney with 16%, Ron Paul with 12% and Rudy Giuliani in fifth with 11%.

Huckabee is viewed favorably by 70% of Likely Republican Primary Voters, McCain by 63%, Giuliani by 63%, Romney by 62%, and Paul by 25%

McCain is seen as the most electable Republican—70% believe he would be at least somewhat likely to win the White House if nominated. Fifty-nine percent (59%) believe Huckabee would have a chance to win while 55% say the same about both Giuliani and Romney. Just 12% believe Paul would have a chance to win the election if nominated.

Georgia Democratic Presidential Primary

Georgia: Obama 41% Clinton 35%
Friday, January 25, 2008

The latest Rasmussen Reports telephone survey in Georgia shows Barack Obama leading Hillary Clinton by six percentage points, 41% to 35%. John Edwards is a distant third at 13%.

As in other states in the Democratic race, there is a significant racial divide. Obama leads 59% to 28% among African-American voters while Clinton leads 44% to 25% among White Voters.

While Obama has the lead, Clinton's support is somewhat stronger. Among Clinton voters, 76% say they are "certain" they won't change their mind. For Obama, just 64% are that "certain." As a result, among those who are certain as to how they will vote, the race is even closer—it's Obama 39% and Clinton 38%.

Nationally, Clinton continues to lead Obama in the Rasmussen Reports daily Presidential Tracking Poll.

In Georgia, 81% have a favorable opinion of Clinton and 78% say the same about Obama.

Among those who currently support Edwards, 69% have a favorable opinion of Clinton. Fifty-one percent (51%) of Edwards supporters have a favorable opinion of Obama.

Eighty percent (80%) say that Hillary Clinton would be at least somewhat likely to win in November if nominated. Seventy-five percent (75%) have the same confidence in Obama's electability.

Ninety percent (90%) of Likely Democratic Primary Voters say that the economy is a voting issue. Eighty-two percent (82%) say that Health Care is Very Important and 74% say the same about Government Ethics and Corruption. The War in Iraq is seen as Very Important by 57%.
